Announcement

The Southwest Washington Chapter of the American Institute of Architects Board of Directors is pleased to announce that nominations are now being accepted for the 2009 Charles T. Pearson Community Service Award. This award will be given the evening of **November 19, 2009** at the AIA SWW Design Awards ceremony.

Charles Pearson was a leader among his peers in bettering our community through the practice of architecture and his personal volunteer efforts. Chuck, along with Charles Lea and John Richards began their architectural office in 1937. Lea, Pearson and Richards were tremendously successful and was the largest office in Tacoma for decades, involved in projects across the state.

Professionally, Chuck was one of the founders of the Southwest Washington Chapter of the American Institute of Architects and was its third President in 1958. He was President of AIA Washington Council in 1962 and was elected to the College of Fellows of the AIA in 1973.

In addition to his professional involvement, he liberally gave of his time to better his community. In 1954 he was President of Downtown Tacoma Rotary and in 1969 he was the President of the Chamber of Commerce.

The AIA SWW Chapter endeavors to recognize member architects in our community who are serving or have served in the spirit exemplified by Chuck Pearson during his professional career. - Serving on planning commissions where planning experience influence localities.
- Creating or chairing community groups for physical development of our cities/ neighborhoods.
- Coordinating local groups to save important historical buildings.
- Initiating architects and citizens in joint ventures such as R/UDAT: AIA150 programs.
- Spearheading architects to become active in important plans such as public space development, environmental issues, volunteer homebuilding, etc.
- Involvement in educational programs regarding design, planning and environment.

Activities that are truly community-oriented but do not utilize the unique abilities of an architect will be duly noted, but will be given secondary consideration for this award.

Selection

A jury of two community leaders in the AIA SWW geographic area plus one AIA member architect from outside the AIA SWW will evaluate the submittals and determine the Charles T. Pearson Community Service Award winner. The presentation of the award will be made during the evening of the AIA SWW Design Awards ceremony, **Thursday, November 19, 2009.**

Award

The Award recipient will be honored at the Design Awards ceremony. The recipient will receive an engraved plaque and have their name added to a perpetual plaque at the AIA office, and \$500 will be donated to the community service organization, charity or endowment of the recipient's choice.
